

ACADEMIC DIFFICULTIES

If your student is having difficulties with a class, please contact the teacher. Any teacher can be reached via Aeries (email) or telephone at the main office line. Be aware that teachers often do not receive messages until the end of the school day, and will return your call as soon as they are able. If you have already had teacher contact and your child's problem has not been resolved, please contact your child's counselor.

AERIES

Bear Creek parents are encouraged to take advantage of the Aeries Student Information System's powerful features in order to keep track of your child's attendance and grades. You can check your child's attendance for the day, see how they scored on a test, or if they turned in last week's homework. This is an invaluable resource for our parents. In order to access Aeries, parent must have a valid and unique email on file with Bear Creek High School.

Bear Creek High School is open to any student of high school age living within the territorial boundaries of the school. Enrollment forms are completed online and all documents must be submitted before an appointment will be made. This includes parent/legal guardian government . issued photo ID, proof of residence, (current PG&E or water bill, etc.), student birth certificate, and complete immunization record. The parent/guardian must be present at the time of enrollment. Further instructions can be found at https://www.lodiusd.net/parents/registration.

GRADING POLICY

Grades are earned on an A-B-C-D-F scale. Daily attendance, class assignments, class participation, homework, class conduct and examinations are all important. An incomplete grade is given for work not completed for reasons beyond the student's control. Questions or clarification regarding grades should be directed to the classroom teacher.

HOMEWORK REQUESTS

If a student has, or is expected to have, 3 or more days excused absences from school, you may request homework from the Attendance Office. Please call 209 -953-8234 x310009 or 310010 for further information.

DRESS CODE

Students are encouraged to show school spirit by dressing in college or military attire on Wednesdays, in blue/silver on Fridays, and in their class colors on Rally Days. The Seniors are green, Juniors are orange, Sophomores are pink, and the Freshman class color is purple.

THE FOLLOWING RULES APPLY:

- 1. All clothing must be neat, clean, in good repair, and an appropriate size.
- 2. TOPS: No bare midriffs, backs or chests (boys or girls). All tops must have at least a 1-inch strap and no part of any undergarment may show. Male tank-top undershirts are not permitted.
- 3. BOTTOMS: Shorts and skirts must be at a minimum of fingertip length (mid-thigh) and pants and shorts must be worn at the waist. No oversized or sagging pants or undergarments showing. No belt buckles with punched-out letters. No cutoffs or pajamas.
- 4. HEADGEAR: No headbands, hair nets, or bandannas. Hats/hoods and/or sunglasses are not to be worn indoors. In accordance with the no-electronics policy, earbuds/AirPods are not allowed during class time. Hats cannot be carried inhand or clipped on belt. Confiscated hats/head gear will be returned to parents only.
- 5: SHOES: Shoes must be worn at all times. No spike heels, house slippers or "wheelys" are allowed.
- 6: Clothing and/or accessories that advertise or allude to violence, alcoholic beverages, tobacco/vape products, or controlled substances; or contain sexual innuendo or are sexually explicit; or that display scantily-clad and/or suggestive images of males or females are prohibited on school grounds and at school activities on and off-campus.
- 7. District policy further prohibits the presence of any apparel (including hats), jewelry, accessories, notebooks, or manner of grooming (including haircuts) which, by virtue of color, arrangement, trademark or any other attribute, denotes membership in a gang or group. Any potentially disruptive clothing/accessories may be restricted, as determined by BCHS administration, at any time.

Bear Creek High School is NOT responsible for lost or stolen items.

POLICY ON VAPING

Bear Creek High School has ZERO TOLERANCE for the use of "smoking" and nicotine/tobacco products.

According to California Penal Code 22950.5, "smoking" means inhaling, exhaling, burning, or carrying any lighted or heated tobacco or plant product intended for inhalation, whether natural or synthetic, in any manner or in any form. "Smoking" includes the use of any electronic smoking device that creates aerosol or vapor, in any manner or in any form, or the use of any oral smoking device for the purpose of circumventing the prohibition of smoking. Along with school discipline, all students may be cited by the SRO for violation of the California Penal Code.

CONFISCATION

Electronic devices, cell phones, IPODS, AirPods, ear buds, hats, etc. cannot be used during school hours, 8:30 AM to 3:20 PM. This does not include passing periods, while moving to and from school buildings, and during lunch time.

Discipline for above mentioned violations: 1st offense, warning & student pick up. 2nd offense, detention & parent pick up. 3rd offense, On Campus Intervention (OCI) & parent pick up. 4th offense and beyond, TWO (2) days of OCI & parent pick up.

Progressive discipline is enforced.

POLICY ON GANG ACTIVITY

LUSD believes that gang activity is dangerous and is not healthy or safe for students. Wearing or displaying any clothing, symbol, logo, or grooming manner that denotes gang activity is prohibited on school grounds and at school activities on and off campus. Gang-affiliated items will be confiscated.

ALCOHOL / DRUG POLICY

To possess, use or be under the influence of an alcoholic beverage and/or any controlled substance will have a minimum consequence of at-home suspension and 45 days social probation. A student on social probation may not attend any school related events, including graduation.

Attendance

CLOSED CAMPUS

Lodi Unified School District has a closed-campus policy for all students. Freshman and sophomore students do not have off-campus privileges. Juniors and seniors may apply quarterly for off-campus privileges. Please see the Counseling Office for further information regarding applications and criteria.

AUTOMATED CALLING SYSTEM

Bear Creek High School uses an Automated Calling System to inform parents of student absences. You will receive a pre-recorded message in the morning and the evening if your student was marked absent. Absences that have been excused **before** 3:00 PM will not be called in the evening. TARDY POLICY

A tardy is defined as arrival to class after the tardy bell rings. Disciplinary consequences are as follows:

1st Tardy: Check in, issued by teacher 2nd Tardy: Warning, issued by teacher

3rd Tardy: Teacher calls home, possible After School Detention assigned by teacher

4th Tardy: Tardy Contract assigned

5th Tardy: After School Detention assigned

6th Tardy: TWO (2) After School Detentions assigned

7th and beyond: ONE (1) day of On Campus Intervention (OCI), possible further disciplinary

consequences.

Failure to Comply with After School Detention will result in On Campus Intervention.

Consequences for 7th tardy and beyond which occur two weeks before a regular two week break may carry over into the next quarter.



FIELD TRIPS

To attend a field trip or speaker presentation, students must obtain a pre-arranged absence form and a permission slip from the advisor sponsoring the activity. A parent or guardian must sign these forms. The sponsoring advisor will excuse the absence with the Attendance Office.

ttendar

Regular attendance and acceptable behavior are the keys to academic success and vocational preparation at Bear Creek High School. Parents and students are encouraged to check attendance records online through the AERIES Portal or by contacting the Attendance Office. Bear Creek High School also utilizes automated calling to notify parents of absences. Please review the following policies and contact the Attendance Office if you have any questions or concerns regarding your student's attendance records.

All absences must be cleared by a parent/guardian within 10 school days.

• In the event your student is absent:

Notes are preferred and should include: first and last name of student, ID number, grade, date(s) and reason for absence.

- *Notes clearing attendance must be written and signed by Parent/Guardian. This ensures parents are aware of the time their student has been out of school, and helps staff determine legitimacy. Notes written in any part by your student will not be accepted and may result in disciplinary action.
- *Parents may excuse up to 14 days of absence (in part or full days) in a school year without providing medical verification.
- *Please provide doctor notes when possible. These are coded MEDICAL and do not count in the student's allotted 14 days.
- *Student absences that are not verified within 10 school days will revert permanently to UNEXCUSED.

PERMIT TO LEAVE EARLY OR ARRIVE LATE

Students needing to leave school early for a medical/dental appointment must bring a note to the Attendance Office before leaving campus to get a Permit to Leave. Please follow this policy to avoid delays in reaching your student at exit time and to help avoid classroom disruptions. Students must check into the Attendance Office upon return to campus. Students arriving late much bring a parent note with the information listed above. Students arriving without a note may receive disciplinary action. Leaving campus early or arriving late without a Permit to Leave will be considered a truancy.

PRE-ARRANGED ABSENCES Pre-Arranged does not necessarily mean the absence is excused.

Please see the Attendance Office if you have any questions. Any foreseen absences require a prearranged absence form to be completed prior to the date/s of absence. Please allow three (3) days notice to complete this process.

On Campus - Students who wish to attend presentations on campus must pre-arrange their absence from classes at least one (1) day in advance of the scheduled presentation.

Off Campus – Parents may request a pre-arranged absence for 5 days of instruction. Examples of absence types are:

EXCUSED ABSENCES

- *Personal injury/illness (doctor's note required if over 5 days)
- *Medical/dental appointments
- *Court appearances
- *Bereavement of immediate family
- *School-sponsored activity

UNEXCUSED ABSENCES

- *Car Trouble/Overslept
- *Truancy/Cuts
- *Suspension
- *Any other absence not falling under the category of excused absences at right

Students with excused-cleared absences are entitled to make up all work. It is the student's responsibility to contact his/her teacher to arrange for make-up work and a timeline for completion. Reminder: Teachers are not required to provide make-up work for unverified/unexcused absences

PROGRAM/CLASS CHANGES

School and district policy discourages program/class change requests made after students are scheduled and attending classes. Student-initiated program changes will only be considered to correct an error or to adjust a student's schedule to the proper level of subject complexity with teacher recommendation, and are only accepted within the first three weeks of the semester. All program change requests are subject to counselor review and administration approval.

*Changes will <u>NOT</u> be made for teacher, lunch, period, or location preference.

CREDIT ACCOUNTING

Five credits are earned for each semester course which is completed successfully. Students that pass all of their classes each semester earn 30 full credits.

NO VARIABLE CREDIT

Any student entering school after the start date or leaving before the end of the semester, must make up all work or he/she will earn ZERO (0) credit for the semester.



GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:

All students must have a minimum of 230 credits to graduate from Bear Creek High School.

COLLEGE ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

<u>CALIFORNIA COMMUNITY COLLEGE ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS</u> – Students who are 18 years of age or who have finished high school are eligible to enter a California community college. Assessment testing for proper placement may be required. A student wishing to enter a community college outside his/her district of residence may do so. Bear Creek and LUSD have developed an extension partnership with Delta College.

SAN JOAQUIN DELTA COLLEGE

High school students may enroll in courses at Delta College for either high school elective credit or college credit while being concurrently enrolled at Bear Creek. Students wanting to take courses at Delta College must contact the Delta College Admissions Office for specific information regarding enrollment. See your counselor for details.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA AND CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

History/Social Science: required courses include 1 year of US History/Government, and 1 year of World History, Cultures, and Geography (2 years required/recommended)

English: Composition, Literature, etc. (4 years required)

Mathematics: Algebra I, Geometry and Algebra II, Integrated Math I/II/III (3 years required, 4 years recommended)

Laboratory Science: 2 years of laboratory science providing fundamental knowledge in at least two of these three areas: Biology, Chemistry and Physics (2 years required, 3 years recommended)

Foreign Language: 2 years of the same language required; 3 recommended

Visual and Performing Arts: 1 year required

College Preparatory Electives: 1 year in addition to those required above, chosen from one of the above or ap-

proved solely in the elective areas.

Incoming 9th grade students begin with a clean grade slate. This gives everyone the opportunity to participate in athletic/extra curricular activities. However, continued participation will require a 2.0 grade point average in the 1st quarter grading period with no more than one (1) F. The grade reports determine continued eligibility which will be issued at the end of each quarter thereafter. Participating students must also meet standards of satisfactory citizenship and attendance.

Athletic Clearance Requirements

Before practicing (or trying out) each student-athlete must have:

- A minimum GPA of 2.0 with no more than one F on the report for the grading period for that season of sport (all incoming freshmen are exempt from this requirement for the beginning of Fall Sports only).
- Sports physical and online clearance completed and signed by student-athlete, parent and doctor. Physical must be dated AFTER May 1, 2022.

ATHLETIC OFFICE HOURS: 8:30 AM - 4:30 PM Hours may vary on game days.

NCAA:

If students are planning to enroll in college as a freshman and they wish to participate in Division I or II intercollegiate athletics,

- Meet core curriculum requirements: 16 core courses / 32 semester courses.
- Have a core-course grade-point average and a combined score on the SAT or ACT based on the qualifier index
- Complete a clearinghouse application at the end of 11th 3.
- Graduate from high school.

See ncaa.org and eligibilitycenter.org for course requirements, qualifier index scale and other information.

FALL Sports offered are football, boys'/girls' cross country, girls volleyball, girls' tennis, boys' & girls' water polo, girls' golf and sideline cheer.

WINTER Sports offered are wrestling, boys'/girls' basketball, boys' soccer, and girls' soccer.

SPRING Sports offered are badminton, baseball, boys volleyball, boys' golf, softball, boys'/girls' swimming, diving, boys' tennis, and track.

ALL SPORT STARTING DATES ARE TO BE DETERMINED

Each student who participates in any sport must provide evidence of a physical examination and show proof of medical insurance. For the 2022-2023 school year, all physicals must be dated AFTER May 1, 2022. Physical packets will be available online at bearcreek.lodiusd.net/athletics.

REQUIREMENTS FOR P.E.:

ALL 9TH AND 10TH GRADERS TAKE P.E. DURING THE SCHOOL DAY. P.E. IS A TWO-YEAR GRADUATION REQUIREMENT PER STATE LAW.

All students must dress for P.E. If a student forgets his/her P.E. clothes, loaners are available.

It is important that students dress in the **approved** P.E. uniform daily as the participation grade factors into the entire grade for the quarter/semester.

P.E. makeups are offered every week. Contact your P.E. teacher for more information.

A lock will be issued at the beginning of the year for the P.E. locker. Students are to return the lock at the end of the school year or have a fine applied to their account.

P.E. uniforms are to be purchased from your P.E. teacher. Order forms are available from your PE teacher or the Athletic Office.



CAFETERIA/FOOD SERVICE

The cafeteria offers a complete hot lunch daily. Free breakfast will be served each day. A snack/salad bar are also available. Applications for free or reduced-price meals should be completed online at SchoolLunchApp.com as soon as possible. All school behavior rules apply in the cafeteria.

PERSONAL MESSAGES & DELIVERIES

Personal messages or deliveries WILL NOT be accepted and/or delivered to students unless there is an emergency. We DO NOT accept flowers, balloons, commercial/retail food deliveries such as GrubHub, Door Dash, etc., or other items for delivery to students. Please do not arrange for deliveries of these kinds of items to the school as they will not be accepted.

LIBRARY

The library is available for library books, textbooks, and Chromebook checkout before school, during lunch, after school, and during class time with a handwritten pass from a teacher. Your ID card is required for all checkouts. It is advised to never leave books behind, give them to a teacher or to someone else to return. Students are responsible for all materials that are checked out to them and will be billed for any loss or damage.

SCHOOL NURSE

BUS TRANSPORTATION

Bus transportation is available for students living at certain distances from the school. Pick up a schedule in the Counseling Office or call District Transportation at 209-331-7170.

IDENTIFICATION CARDS

Each student will be issued a Bear Creek High ID card which must be carried at all times. This ID card is required to enter the campus. In addition, a valid, current Bear Creek ID card is required at all school functions as well as to check out library books, chromebooks, and textbooks.

Replacement cards can be purchased for \$5 in the Enrollment Office before or after school or at lunchtime only.

1st violation for no ID = warning 2nd violation= detention 3rd offense = 2 detentions 4th offense = 1 day in On-Campus Intervention.

MEDICATION FORMS

If a student takes prescription medication or requires an over-the-counter medication during the school day, a Medication-In-School form must be completed. 1:1 CHROMEBOOKS: Beginning in the 2019-2020 school year, Bear Creek High School will participate in the 1:1 Home to School Connection Initiative. All students will be assigned a Chromebook intended to be used both at school and home. Students may purchase insurance coverage (Chromebook Care Plan) for \$25 until the end of the 3rd week of school. This is strongly encouraged.
