### **COURSE DESCRIPTIONS**

### ENG 37 Women in Literature

This course is a study of women in literature in short fiction, drama, poetry, and the novel. It focuses on women writers, female characters, literature written for women, and literature written about the lives of women. (UC, CSU) - Units: 3.

#### ENG 38 Mythology

This course is designed to provide the student with an introduction to the literature of Greek, Roman, and Norse mythology. Other universal myths may be included. The course provides a background for understanding of allusions, form, and content of recurring themes in modern literature as well as revealing the continued influence of mythological motifs on customs, traditions, beliefs, and values. (UC, CSU) - Units: 3.

#### HIST 34 Asian Pacific American History

This course is a survey lecture course that examines the social, political, economic, and cultural history of Asian immigrants and Asian Americans in the United States from the 1850s to the present. The emphasis is on the Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Asian Indian, Filipino, Vietnamese, Cambodian, Lao, Hmong, and Native Hawaiian experiences. Themes include the immigration and settlement patterns of diverse Asian groups, occupational patterns, family and community formation, race relations, and policies. (UC, CSU) - Units: 3.

#### LAW 16 Introduction to Social Justice: Law and Social Change

This course involves the interdisciplinary study of class, ethnicity, gender, and race in the United States. It examines social justice movements in relation to class, gender, ethnic, and racial groups in the United States to provide a basis for a better understanding of the cultural, political, and socio-economic conditions among key social groups. Topics include the relationship between law and social change in cross-cultural settings, as well as the analysis of legislation, as they relate to social change. (UC, CSU, C-ID SJS 110) - Units: 3.

\*Advisories: BUS 8, LAW 2, and POLSC 1 each with a grade of "C" or better.

#### **POLSC 1** American Government and Institutions

This course is an introduction to the fundamentals of government and the political processes at the national, state, and local levels. It examines the basic issues confronted by the American people and their governing institutions. The course fulfills the Social Science (Group A) requirements for the AA degree and applies toward the requirement in U.S. History and CA state and local government. (UC, CSU, C-ID POLS 110), 3 units.

\*Advisories: ENG 1A with a grade of "C" or better and ability to read at the 12th grade level.

\*Advisories are recommendations. They are not prerequisites in order to register in the course(s).

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
